1. Scale-up of Surgical Services Goal

To address the growing demand for specialized care, we are tripling our surgical theater capacity. Moving from two to six operational suites will enable us to eliminate surgical backlogs and support a multi-disciplinary approach to complex care. This expansion will facilitate dedicated spaces for specialized teams in Trauma, Orthopedics, Ophthalmology, and Endoscopy, ensuring world-class outcomes for every surgical patient.

Summary

Construction of 4 new theatre shells with specialized HVAC, medical gas piping, and modern anesthesia workstations. Cost Estimate Ksh 128,410,000.



2. Enhanced Imaging Services Goal

To eliminate external referrals and ensure rapid clinical intervention, we are establishing a state-of-the-art diagnostic imaging center. By integrating advanced technology, including MRI, CT, Point-of-Care Ultrasound (POCUS), and specialized cardiac and neurological monitoring tools, our team will be empowered to provide precise, timely diagnoses for life-threatening conditions. This investment represents a transformative leap in bringing world class healthcare to our community

Summary

Procurement of multi-slice CT Scan, 1.5T MRI, Digital Mammography, and Echo/3D Ultrasound machines, including shielded room construction. Cost Estimate Ksh 218,230,000.



3. Comprehensive Funeral Home Goal

To enhance the end-of-life care, we are establishing a full-service funeral home designed to offer a seamless and respectful experience for bereaved families. By investing in modern hearse vehicles, professional embalming facilities, and expanded manpower, we will provide a holistic suite of services that integrates physical preparation with essential spiritual and emotional chaplaincy support

Summary

Construction of a new mortuary and chapel, 10-body refrigeration units, and procurement of 2 customized hearse vehicles. Cost Estimate Ksh 43,400,000.



4. Strengthening Perimeter Security Goal

To ensure the safety of our patients, staff, and visitors, we are fortifying the hospital grounds with an electric-supported stone perimeter wall. This security measure includes a second strategic entrance, designed to optimize the flow of traffic and deliveries while maintaining a secure environment.

Summary

Building a 1,200m stone wall with electric fencing, 30 IP-CCTV cameras, and automated entry barriers. Cost Estimate Ksh 28,290,000.



5. Expansion to University College Goal

We aim to elevate the Methodist College of Health Sciences to a constituent University College of Health Sciences, dedicated to cultivating the next generation of healthcare leaders. This transformation will involve expanding our academic portfolio beyond our current three programs, modernizing our infrastructure, and scaling our faculty and staffing levels to meet university standards.

Summary

Construction of an administration block, student hostels, and specialized simulation labs, plus the CUE charter application. Cost Estimate Ksh 137,000,000.



6. Outpatient Facelift & Restructuring Goal

We are transforming the outpatient unit by optimizing patient flow, modernizing facilities, and integrating advanced technology. These strategic upgrades are designed to minimize wait times, improve clinical throughput, and provide a more accessible, high-quality experience for every patient.

Summary

Cabro paving for parking, Corporate branding, clear signage. Specialized Clinics and Wings partitioning of eight additional consultation suites, and implementation of a digital patient queuing system. Estimate Cost Ksh 20,375,000.



7. Laboratory Upgrade & ISO Certification Goal

To maintain our lead in diagnostic excellence, we are upgrading the laboratory with cutting edge technology and advanced blood culture machines. These enhancements will support our goal of obtaining ISO certification for a broader range of testing services

Summary

Lab renovation with a sample chute system, automated blood culture/PCR machines, and ISO 15189 consultancy. Cost Estimate Ksh 36,700,000.



8. Specialized Clinics & Wings Goal

To ensure that no patient is forced to seek care outside our region, we are establishing specialized clinics and high-impact services in dialysis, daycare/ambulatory procedures, and oncology over the next two years. This expansion will provide local access to routine specialized outpatient and semi-inpatient care.

Summary

Eight hemodialysis machines, a chemotherapy compounding hood, endoscopy units, neonatal incubators. Establishing stand alone doctors' Plaza and corporate wing and inpatient wing renovations. Cost Estimate Ksh 55,180,000.
